PROTECTION

Ensuring protection for underserved communities is a vital necessity to survival—therefore, it is a priority to MWL that we guarantee safety for our communities in need. We've been utilizing multiple methods to provide protection services, including cash for protection and protection by mine action.

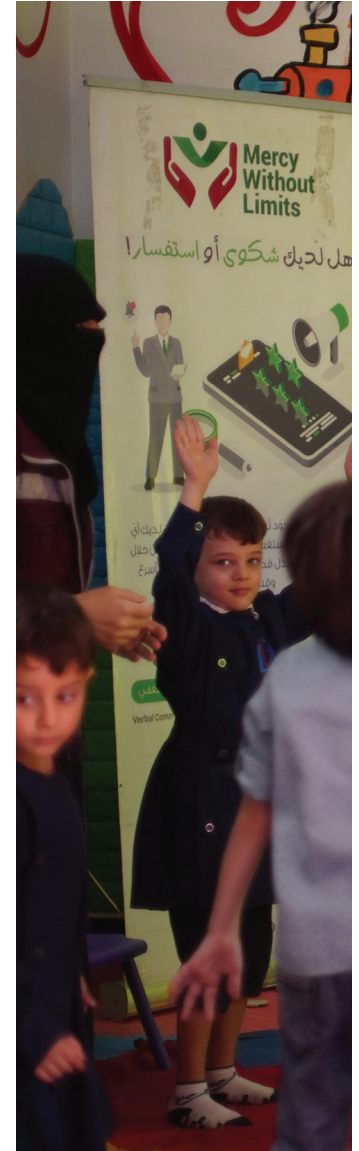


Our Cash for Protection program distributed financial assistance to more than **120 families**. MWL also provided Cash for Education, Cash for Food, and Cash for Work for individuals this during 2022 benefiting nearly **10,000 people** in need.

CHILD PROTECTION

Children across the world who've been displaced by natural disasters, economic struggles or conflicts, have been identified as a vulnerable group that could be at risk of additional physical, psychological and psychosocial problems. It is a prioritized focus of humanitarian organizations worldwide to care for children's physical and mental health.

MWL is taking part in this mission by partnering with humanitarian agencies to conduct projects worldwide. Child protection programs MWL is involved in include recreational activities, structured and semi structured psychological support; and awareness campaigns that focus on subjects such as personal hygiene



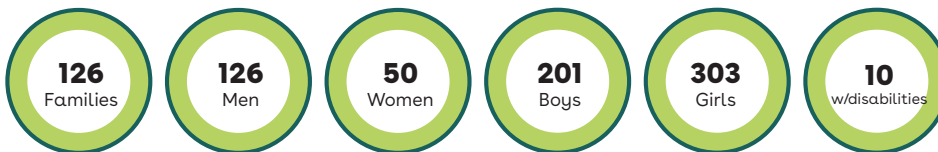


CASH FOR PROTECTION

Our Cash Assistance for Protection program functions in the protection sector of humanitarian efforts in 8 countries. The aim of this program is to increase protection and aid for those in need—predominantly orphans and widows. Through Cash for Protection, MWL provides cash assistance covering basic necessities, as well as physical and mental healthcare. Cash assistance is also provided for additional services that are determined based on demand.

Risk education activities were provided to the most vulnerable and at-risk groups of children and their caregivers; following Covid 19 social-distancing guidelines.

MWL continues to be determined in providing support to our most vulnerable communities. In 2022, MWL the Cash for Protection and Emergency Case Fund (ECP) was provided to:



PROTECTION SERVICES:

- **Bi-annual health checkups for children**
- **Follow-up medical care**
- **Holiday clothing and gifts**
- **Seasonal food baskets**

PROTECTION BY MINE ACTION

Risk education activities were provided to the most vulnerable and at-risk groups of children and their caregivers; following Covid 19 social-distancing guidelines.

Case Management

MWL provides case management primarily to children most at risk of being put into child labor, child recruitment, or childhood marriage. It also includes children formally associated with armed groups (CAFAG) but who were released or separated from the groups, and unaccompanied children (UASC); as well as children with disabilities and/or physical and psychological injuries. Because these children

are often in vulnerable circumstances, MWL provides services, guidance, and protection to them to ensure that their needs are met. This past year, 605 referrals were made and MWL provided case management to 1438 boys, 723 girls, and 765 persons with disabilities. With your continued support, we look forward to providing care and aid to more children in need.

Referral and Follow-Up

The Child Protection Mobile team provides children in and out of the camps with safe identification, referrals and follow-ups to other available services (such as NFI, Health and Livelihood).

PSS Activities

PSS activities included providing a set of structured animated videos to children and their caregivers that incorporated contextualized and culturally-sensitive language.

Emergency Case Fund (ECF)

This is the total provided value of assistance from 10 dollars to 100 dollars, used to provide emergency, situation-based assistance to children at risk (whether mild, moderate or severe).







SHELTER AND NFI

Shelter is one of the basic necessities of daily life; it gives families comfort and security, shielding them from the world around them—which is not always safe. Families worldwide have been displaced, losing their homes from tragedy and disaster, leaving themselves without adequate shelter. In response, MWL constructed 88 apartment blocks to shelter a total of 528 people in warm and safe shelters. During this past year’s bleak winters, MWL also provided tents, blankets and heating facilities to families in need.

EDUCATION

Mercy Without Limits strongly believes in the mission to bring education to underserved communities across the globe. Equipping children and adults with the necessary tools they need to develop their knowledge and skills will enable them to bring about lasting change to their community. Achieving this goal also enables individuals to be self-sustained through their own talents and abilities they have been able to develop through their education.

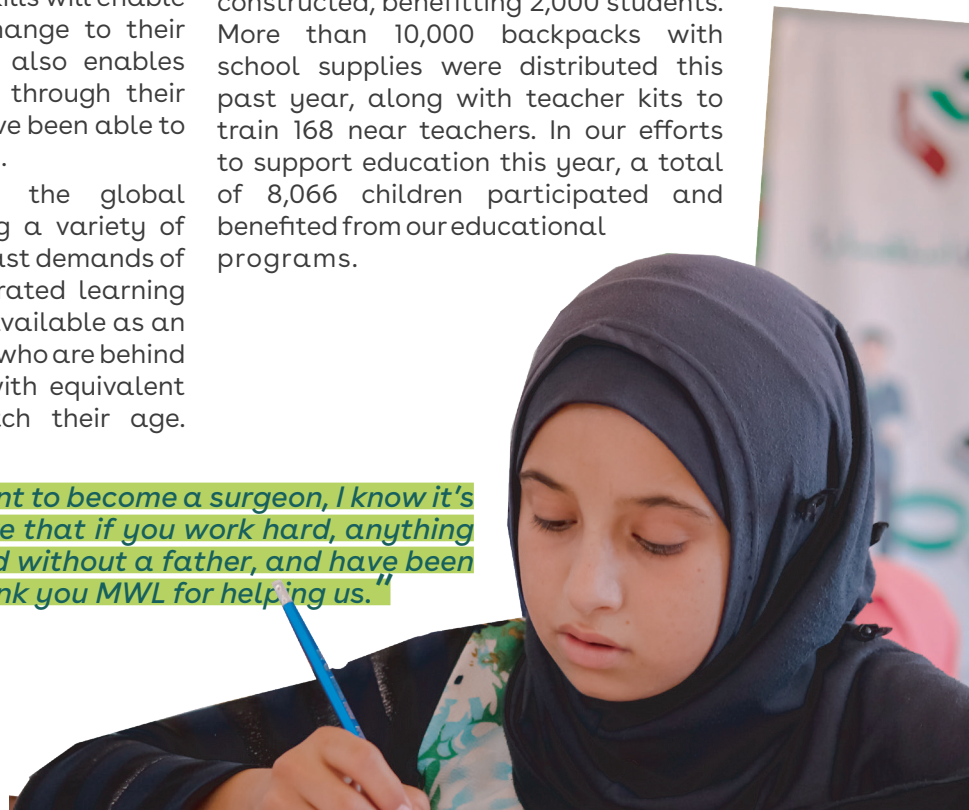
MWL works towards solving the global education crisis by implementing a variety of education projects, meeting the vast demands of basic educational needs. Accelerated learning programs have also been made available as an option to disadvantaged children who are behind academically to provide them with equivalent educational standards to match their age.

Children with special needs were served in all projects, maintaining equal opportunity for all children to learn.

With MWL's help, two schools were constructed, benefitting 2,000 students. More than 10,000 backpacks with school supplies were distributed this past year, along with teacher kits to train 168 near teachers. In our efforts to support education this year, a total of 8,066 children participated and benefited from our educational programs.

FOOD SECURITY

Families around the world suffer from hunger and a lack of adequate nutrition. Mercy Without Limits is aware of the struggles people are facing with food scarcity, and we partner with other NGOs to implement agriculture and livelihood services in an effort to provide sustainable nourishment to those facing food scarcity. With the aid from provided funds, MWL is able to distribute food baskets, Ramadan hot meals, and additional food resources. In 2022, MWL was able to distribute 11,045 food baskets to 10,469 families; in addition, we were able to feed 29,349 families with the meat from Qurbani rituals, completing a religious requirement while also helping those in need. The projects implemented aim at providing sustainable nourishment to those facing food scarcity by improving economic circumstances and depleting the inflation rate.





HEALTH

There are countless situations that have led to poor health conditions due to displacement, violence and social instability around the world—and all of them had been exacerbated by the Covid 19 pandemic. The insufficiency of healthcare facilities, including lack of water, supplies and electricity, has led to outbreaks of disease as well as an increase in the morbidity and mortality rate in communities at risk.

In response, Mercy Without Limits participated extensively in providing health care services to people affected worldwide. We took the initiative to support the Yemen Academic Hospital in Taiz City, providing medical equipment and support for residents in need. With your help, MWL look forwards to continuing to bring medical treatment to those in need.

EARLY RECOVERY AND LIVELIHOOD

Mercy Without Limits equips individuals with resources that will enable them to be successful leaders in their communities. Every year, MWL takes part in projects that help women and youth develop financial independence. In 2022, we provided training programs that taught life skills, including those necessary to launch a business and develop financial independence. In addition to training, MWL is continuously looking for ways to expand and maintain its already existing institutions. Three roads were paved near the refugee camps, benefitting more than 3000 individuals. With efficient roads comes independence in transportation and gathering resources—leading to a better quality of life.





WASH - WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

Communities worldwide suffer from a lack of water and the means to maintain adequate hygiene in an effort to improve health and community conditions. MWL targeted this epidemic by constructing water wells and orchestrating projects that enabled access to safe water and sanitation. This past year, MWL installed 58 deep wells, benefitting nearly 6,000 families. To address hygiene concerns, in 2022 MWL distributed 300 hygiene kits and conducted hygiene sessions for 125 families. We believe a community can only thrive when it has the necessary resources to live.

SEASONAL PROJECTS

MWL understands that from weather changes to natural disasters, there are times of the year that bring even more difficulties to those in need. With this in mind, our team works year-round through a variety of seasonal projects that aid our beneficiaries through additional hardships. In 2022, Mercy Without Limits took part in such seasonal projects as providing food baskets during Ramadan and gifts for the Eid holidays, along with providing heaters, blankets and coats for families during the harsh winters.
